**Sub: Bye Election to WBLA from 35 - Raiganj, 90 - Ranaghat Dakshin (SC), 94 - Bagda (SC) & 167 - Maniktala Assembly Constituency, 2024 in the State of West Bengal – Grant of Paid Holiday - Regarding.**

Sir,

Consequent to the Press Note No. ECI/PN/120/2024 dated 10.06.2024 read with Election Commission of India Notification No. 78/EPS/2024 dated 11.06.2024, **Bye Election to WBLA from 35 - Raiganj, 90 - Ranaghat Dakshin (SC), 94 - Bagda (SC) & 167 - Maniktala Assembly Constituency, 2024** in the state of West Bengal is going to be held on **10.07.2024 (Wednesday)**.

The Governor has been pleased to make obligatory, on the part of the employers of any business, trade, undertaking, shops, commercial and industrial establishment to **declare the scheduled date of poll for the Assembly Constituencies concerned as paid holiday** under Section 135B of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951, for their workers to enable them to exercise their franchise in the ensuing election. In case of re-poll, the employees / workers shall be allowed to cast their votes on the date of re-poll and the date of re-poll shall also be declared as paid holiday. Section 135B of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951 is reproduced below :-

**Section 135B : Grant of paid holiday to employees on the day of poll :**

- (1) Every person employed in any business, trade, industrial undertaking or any other establishment and entitled to vote an election to the House of people or the Legislative Assembly of a State, shall, on the day of Poll, be granted a holiday.
- (2) No deduction or abatement of the wages of any such person shall be made on account of a holiday having been granted in accordance with Sub-section (1) and if such person is employed on the basis of that he would not ordinarily receive wages for such day, he shall none-the-less be paid for such day the wages he would have drawn had not a holiday been granted to him on that day.
- (3) If an employer contravenes the provisions of sub- Section (1) or Sub-Section (2), then such employer shall be punishable with fine, which may extend to five hundred rupees.
- (4) This section shall not apply to any elector whose absence may cause danger or substantial loss in respect of the employment in which he is engaged.

The above provisions require that all the electors who are employee of establishments and shops including those which work on shift basis shall be granted a paid holiday on the day of poll in the Constituency where the Bye-elections are to be held. Further, there may be cases where a person is ordinarily resident of the Constituency and registered as an elector, may be serving or employed in an industrial undertaking or an establishment located outside the Constituencies having bye poll. It is clarified that in such a situation, even those electors


including casual workers working outside the constituency concerned would be entitled to the benefit of a paid holiday extended under the Section 135B(1) of the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

The daily wage/casual workers are also entitled for a holiday and wages on poll day as provided in Section 135B of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951.

You are therefore, requested to please instruct your constituent members to grant a paid holiday on the day of poll to the concerned Constituencies for all categories of workers and employees abiding by the Section 135(B) of the Representation of Peoples Act, 1951, so that, they can exercise their franchise in the aforesaid election.


